UIL RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR HIGH SCHOOL REGARDING SCHOOL DISTRICT GRANTED TRANSFERS

Note: Any questions regarding University Interscholastic League (UIL) eligibility should be addressed to the Athletic Director.

If a transfer is granted to a student to attend a high school outside of their attendance zone please be aware of the following:

The student that is granted the transfer will be eligible for varsity competition at the school in which the transfer was granted. Once that student attends class at that school, they will have established their eligibility according to the UIL. Please know that once a student has established eligibility in a high school outside of his or her attendance zone, it is considered a transfer (by the UIL) for the student to return to the high school designated for the student's attendance zone. Due to it being considered a transfer by the UIL, that student would lose one year of varsity eligibility.

Example 1: Student zoned for Bryan High but is granted a transfer to participate in Gymnastics at Rudder their Freshman Year. If that student drops out of Gymnastics and is required to return Bryan High, (the school in which they were zoned). The student loses one year of varsity eligibility according to the UIL.

Example 2: Student zoned for Rudder High but is granted a transfer to attend Bryan High to be in the IB program. That student is eligible for varsity athletics at Bryan High. If the student drops out of the IB program and is required to return to Rudder High School (the school in which they were zoned). The student loses one year of varsity eligibility according to the UIL.
